New for All Users

Login Improvement

The login process has been improved by allowing username to be case insensitive. Regardless of how your username was created, you can log in by typing your username in all upper case, all lower case, or mixed case – as long as all the correct characters are entered, you're good to go! Of course, your password IS still case sensitive and must be entered exactly as you specified when you created it.

Performance Improvement

To improve performance when loading the Participant Details page, all Common Events are now collapsed by default.

- Click the Common Event title bar to expand each common event and view the event details.

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
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New for Data Managers




Share Page: View a Previously Published Version of a Study
